Dear Fellow NROTC Alumnus,

The 1995 Membership Drive was very successful. Thank you for responding with a Membership Donation and also for providing current addresses for yourself and your shipmates. A combined Trust Fund and Reunion Mailing is being provided this year to maximize the productivity of our newsletter staff. PNS CAPT Bill Graner, USN, is enclosing a personal message to each of you in this mailing, and his staff is providing the envelope insertion and mailing of this combined newsletter.

Three important messages are enclosed:

1995 Reunion Features All Former Crow's Nest Members

The 9th Annual Reunion on 4 Nov 95 will feature all former Crow's Nest members. To set the mood for these activities, we are reprinting a letter from CAPT George H. White, S.C., USN (Ret), 1951, dated 18 April 94:

Dear UT NROTC Alumni Association:

Upon opening my son Steve's NROTC Alumni Newsletter, I found my name on your "dead" list, otherwise known as ANK. I was in the class of 51, not 50 as you indicate.

I very much enjoyed reading your newsletter, and will make every attempt to attend your reunion this year. It would be good to see more members of the class of 51 be in the association.

I don't know whether anyone is keeping a history of the unit and its activities. One colorful bit of history concerns the Crow's Nest, which for over 20 years played a role in the life of the unit. Upon returning from my 2nd class cruise in 1949, I somehow met up with about 10 guys who had just come back from their 3rd class cruise. We had no idea where we were going to live when the fall semester started, and we were all (to put it mildly) poor. We decided we would rent a house, hire a cook, and start a CO-OP. I can't remember all the names, but I'm certain William Robert Brown, Steve Albrecht, Frank T. Woodall, Henry J. Rech, Joe Rice, and Richard L. McVay were plank owners in that enterprise. I also believe T.J. O'Neill, Roscoe H. Cannon, and James A. Schriener were original members. A contest was held to determine the name, and "Crow's Nest" was the winner. It was definitely a low-rent operation. We rented a moderately run-down two-story house immediately behind the then Kappa Gamma house. I understand the education building now occupies the spot. Much of the silverware was "liberated" from local restaurants and the Commons. The PNS wanted no part in recognizing us. I'm not certain how long the "Nest" remained in that original location, but in about 1960, when I was Material Division officer at NAS Corpus, some UT middies came to see me with a requisition for surplus furniture, etc., with which to "upgrade" the Nest. The Unit was giving at least some support. In 1973, my son Steve became a UT middie, and I went with him to visit the Nest. It was on 24th Street. Hardly the Taj Mahal, and the following year, the Nest moved to a location on Nueces. A couple of years later, Steve became President of the Nest, and enlisted me and my old Crow's Nest roommate Bob Brown, a lawyer in Houston, to help get funding for a first rate Nest. The Nesters had hired an architect and had some nice plans. We tried several sources, the major one being Ross Perot. There was no luck, and I understand the Nest moved still again into a rented place. Since Steve graduated, I've lost track of the fate of the Nest. I understand it is no more, but I'm sure many of the guys who lived there can remember some great times.

Matching Gifts

Many corporations have matching gift programs in which the company will match the gifts of their employees. If your employer has such a program, your gift may be matched dollar-for-dollar, or even two-for-one or more. Please check with your personnel office because you must obtain the matching gift form from your company.

A matching gift account has been established with the Office of Associate Vice President and Business Manager (Development Office) of the University of Texas at Austin in order to implement the matching gift program. The account is entitled "Naval Science - Naval ROTC Alumni Scholarship Fund", and the Department of Naval Science has control of granting scholarships and fellowships from this account. The University has set up this account as an interest bearing account which can grow in value. Note that our Association will provide guidance to the PNS in managing this account for awarding scholarships, but IRS regulations prohibit a donor from specifying the recipient of his or her donation. The account # for the INFLOW OF GIFTS is 30-7446-9093, and this number should appear on the checks of matching gift participants. For information only, the account # for the OUTFLOW OF SCHOLARSHIPS is 30-7446-9070.

Step-by-step instructions are included in this newsletter along with a sample matching gift form used by Texas Instruments Foundation. This particular form is for TI employees only, and it is included for information only to acquaint you with the matching gift concept.

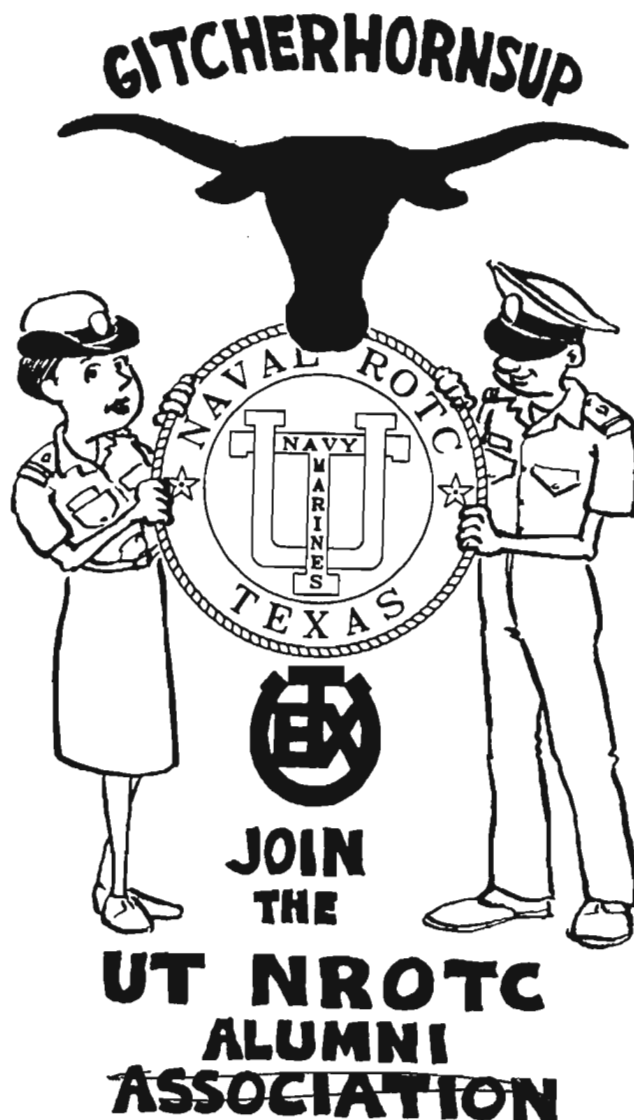

The Program

The Texas Instruments Foundation Educational Matching Gift Program was established to encourage Texas Instruments employees, retirees and directors to contribute to colleges and universities. It provides an effective way of assisting you in contributing to the quality of education. Dollars you contribute to qualified institutions you wish to support will be matched on a dollar-for-dollar basis by the Foundation.

The Texas Instruments Foundation's matching payment will be an unrestricted grant.

Eligible Individuals

- Any employee (active or on LOA) on the U.S. payroll of Texas Instruments or a Texas Instruments subsidiary.
- Any retiree of Texas Instruments.
- Any director or retired director of Texas Instruments.

Eligible Institutions

- Four-year private or public colleges or universities (including schools or colleges within a university that conduct their own fund-raising effort) **physically located in the U.S.** that grant bachelor's, masters or doctoral degrees.
- Private or public colleges and universities (including schools or colleges within a university that conduct their own fund-raising effort) **physically located in the U.S.** offering less than four years of undergraduate work which also offer a curriculum for full-time graduate study.
- The institution must be accredited by one of the six nationally recognized accrediting associations.
- The institution must be recognized by the Internal Revenue Service for tax-deductible contributions.
- Alumni funds, foundations or associations that have a tax-exempt status and have been established by an institution for the purpose of collecting funds. Such institutions must meet the criteria above.

Eligible Gifts

- Gifts may be made by eligible individuals to more than one institution. The individual need not have attended the institution to which the gift is made.
- **The minimum single gift eligible for matching by the Foundation is \$25.** The maximum amount of all gifts by an individual in any year calendar year that will be matched is \$1,000.
- Gifts may be cash, personal checks, cashier checks, money orders, or securities having daily published market values. The value of securities will be the market value on the date the contribution is made. Major credit cards may be used to make gifts to qualified organizations which accept these cards.

Designation of Gift

- Gift may be designated for a particular school or department or purpose as long as it is within the policy of the Foundation. Capital expenditures, operational purposes such as fellowships, instructional and research equipment, scholarship funds, and staff supplementation are within the Foundation's policy.

Ineligible Institutions

- Elementary and secondary schools, public or private.
- Junior colleges, or two-year colleges not offering a curriculum for full-time graduate study.
- Fraternities, honor societies and educational associations.
- Tax-exempt education funds whose sole purpose is to raise money for its member colleges which are individually eligible under the program (e.g., New England College Fund, Texas Foundation for Voluntary Support of Colleges, United Negro College Fund, Kentucky Independent College Fund, etc.).

Ineligible Gifts

- Pledged gifts. Gifts must be made (**NOT MERELY PLEDGED**).
- TV and FM stations owned by the educational institution. (**PLEASE MAKE GIFT UNDER THE ARTS AND CULTURAL MATCHING GIFT PROGRAM.**)
- Individual student benefit (except as noted under Designation of Gift).
- Dues or gifts to alumni groups or other groups (e.g., fraternities and sororities) which are not distributed to affiliated eligible educational institutions.
- Ticket purchases.
- Bequeaths.
- Payment in lieu of tuition, books or other student fees.
- Subscription fees for publications.
- Insurance premium payments.
- Gifts-in-kind (e.g., personal or real property, other than securities; value of personal services).
- **Gifts intended to fulfill a person's pledges, tithes, or other church-related financial commitments.**
- **Gifts for athletic scholarships and nonacademic programs, such as any athletic related activity (including athletic booster clubs), stadium construction, or other athletic facilities, glee clubs, and bands.**

Application Procedure

- **Individual**—Complete Part "A" of the form and **send to the institution with your gift.**
- **Institution**—Complete Part "B" of the form verifying the receipt and the intent of the gift in accordance with the conditions of the Matching Gift Program and return the entire form to the Foundation.
- After verification by the Foundation that the gift qualifies for matching, the Foundation completes Part "C" of the form and returns a copy of the form to the qualifying institution, along with a check.
- Matching gift forms may be obtained from various Personnel offices. Retirees and directors may obtain forms from either Personnel offices or the Foundation office. 
- (1) Send back the Your Reunion Committee Needs to Know Form to tell us you will be with us in November, which events you will attend and where you will stay.


